CONSTITUTIONAL PERIOD

George Washington (1789-1797): I was the first president and set precedents. I proved the Constitution through the Whiskey Rebellion. I signed and approved the First Bank of the U.S., the Judiciary Act of 1789, Tariff of 1789, Jay Treaty, and Pinckney Treaty. My Farewell Address talked about avoiding political parties and permanent alliance/neutrality. I leaned toward Federalists.

John Adams (1797-1801): I was the only Federalist president. I had issues with France in the XYZ Affair. I made political enemies with the Alien and Sedition Acts resulting in the Virginia and Kentucky Resolutions. I approved the "Midnight Judges."

AGE OF JEFFERSON

Thomas Jefferson (1801-1809): I was a Democratic-Republican. I doubled the U.S. with the Louisiana Purchase. I love yeoman farmers, but not Barbary Pirates. I had to deal with the Federalist Supreme Court/John Marshall which gave us *Marbury v. Madison* and judicial review. I messed up with the Embargo Act of 1807 and Non-Intercourse Act of 1809.

James Madison (1809-1817): I was a Democratic-Republican. Impressment, Macon's Bill No. 2, and the War Hawks made deal with the War of 1812, but it grew our nationalism. The Federalists would die soon because of Hartford Convention.

James Monroe (1817-1825): I was a Democratic-Republican. I had Good Feelings and dealt with the Missouri Compromise. With the Monroe Doctrine I told Europe to stay out of the Americas. I got Florida from Spain.

John Quincy Adams (1825-1829): I was a Democratic-Republican, but a National Republican at heart. I got here because of the Election of 1824 and Corrupt Bargain against Andrew Jackson. By the way, I signed the Tariff of Abominations...heehee.

AGE OF JACKSON

Andrew Jackson (1829-1837): I was a Democrat. I love states' rights! I inspired the common man and universal male suffrage. I wasn't nice to the Natives. I hated the Bank of the U.S. and through my Specie Circular and pet banks I sort of got us in the Panic of 1837. William Henry Harrison (1841): I was the first Whig and now I'm dead.

Zachary Talyor: (1849-1850): I was a Whig, but owned slaves. I died in office.

Franklin Pierce (1853-1857): I was a Democrat, but I really liked the pro-slavery/Southern Democrats. I made a mess of things with sectionalism and slavery with the Gadsden Purchase, the Ostend Manifesto, and the Kansas-Nebraska Act. I did nothing about Bleeding Kansas. Wasn't I awesome?

James Buchanan (1857-1861): I was a Democrat and was elected because I didn't stir trouble. I got to deal with the Dred Scott case. I endorsed the Lecompton Constitution and Crittenden Compromise which was pro-slavery just so I wouldn't have to deal with slavery, but they all failed which means I am a FAIL.

CIVIL WAR AND RECONSTRUCTION

Abraham Lincoln (1861-1865): I was the first Republican president and had to deal with the Civil War, but I GOT THIS. I was cool with slavery, just don't expand it. Grover Cleveland (1893-1897): I'm back! Just in time for the Panic of 1893. Problems escalate with strikes and unions.

PROGRESSIVE ERA

William McKinley (1897-1901): I'm all about imperialism with the Spanish-American War, Open Door Policy, and Boxer Rebellion. I got shot by an anarchist.

Theodore Roosevelt (1901-1908): I'm a Republican. I'm a Progressive president, just look: Square Deal, trust-busting, arbitrated coal strike, Hepburn Act, Pure Food and Drug Act, Meat Inspection Act, and conservation. I manhandled the world with Big Stick Policy and Roosevelt Corollary.

William Howard Taft (1909-1913): I'm a Republican. I'm all about business with my Dollar Diplomacy. And I like tariffs (Paine-Aldrich Tariff). Told you I was a Republican.

Woodrow Wilson (1913-1921): I'm a Democrat. Check out all the Progressive stuff during me: Federal Trade Commission, Federal Reserve, Clayton Anti-Trust Act, 16th Amendment income tax, 17th Amendment direct elect Senators, 18th Amendment Prohibition, and 19th Amendment women suffrage. And I had to deal with World War I where I presented the League of Nations, but America didn't want it.

ROARING TWENTIES

Warren G. Harding (1921-1923): I'm a Republican. I want a Return to Normalcy. I like peace with the Washington Conference. Love business with the Fordney-McCumber Tariff. Fail with Teapot Dome Scandal.

Calvin Coolidge (1923-1929): I'm a Republican and that's why the Business of America is Business. Peace and neutrality with the Kellogg-Briand Pact. Stop immigrants with National Origins Act.

Herbert Hoover (1929-1933): I'm a Republican and love business. Crash in 1929, but I make it worse by signing Hawley-Smoot Tariff. I look bad with Bonus March. EPIC ECONOMIC FAIL!

GREAT DEPRESSION AND WORLD WAR II

Franklin Delano Roosevelt (1933-1945): I'm a Democrat. I am President almost forever. I help nation during the Great Depression with my New Deal (AAA, NIRA, FDIC, TVA, CCC, Social Security, Wagner Act). I went a bit too far with the court-packing. I swore revenge against Japan, Germany, and Italy during World War II and expanded government then too. I redefine Democrats.
